

Creating a Concrete look with a great texture is quite simple by following these easy instructions. You may want to go to our website for helpful tips on using this unique paint. We know you are excited to start your project, but we really encourage you to read all instructions before beginning. Knowing beforehand when the paint should be wet or dry will produce the best results.

1. Cover your workspace with a non-stick surface and grab a stack of paper towels.
2. Choose your favorite paint brush and painting surface. *Suggested Surfaces: matte and glossy paper; canvas; corrugate; handmade paper; cork and other natural materials are perfect surfaces.*
3. You may want to make a small sample first to test your paints and work on techniques.

****Shake bottles vigorously SIDE-TO-SIDE to mix before each use.***


Step 1: Using a fan brush, coat your surface with Tan. Be sure to let some areas pool. Hold your heat tool about 1-2 inches from the paint until it bubbles.



Step 2: Arbitrarily spray Boardwalk onto your project, leaving some areas without it. Blot it in with a brush and dry.



Step 3: Spray a very small amount of Valencia about 4 inches from your project in a semi-concentrated area. Blot and dry.



Step 4: Spray Chalk about 5-6 inches away from your project in a hairspray motion. Blot with your brush to create different shades. Dry.

Helpful Hints:

- You can let your sample air-dry or for a faster dry time, you can use a heat tool.
- When applying heat to the Glimmer Glaze, it will give a crackle effect or bubbles, adding interest to your project. If this effect is not desired, don't get too close with the heat tool.
